

Sanofi-aventis brings art to Agape House

Thirty-two members of the sanofi-aventis US Information Solutions Department applied their creative energies to Agape House in Somerville on June 25. Employee volunteers built furniture, made artwork and spruced up the buildings and grounds. Volunteers worked with Caring Capital, a corporate team-building program that links companies with nonprofits to advance the common good. Founded in 1988 as the first shelter for homeless families in Somerset County, Agape House provides temporary housing, case management and youth services to homeless families. The 60-bed duplex serves roughly 200 residents annually. Working with Susie Schub, president, and Karen Titterton and Monica Litvany, teaching artists, volunteers made eight fabric wall hangings and five laptop tables.
